



An Investment In Water Infrastructure for Middlesex Centre Residents

A major investment in infrastructure will help ensure residents of the Municipality of Middlesex Centre and their families currently serviced by municipal potable water have continued access to modern, reliable water services that meet their needs.

Today the Government of Canada announced \$649,263 and the Government of Ontario announced \$324,631 investment in the Municipality of Middlesex Centre through the Clean Water Wastewater Fund (CWWF), which will be matched by a contribution of more \$324,631 from the Municipality of Middlesex Centre. The fund is designed to meet immediate priorities for clean water and wastewater to support a cleaner and healthier environment for communities.

The combined \$1.2 million investment will be used to replace the existing Delaware water tower standpipe and increase its reservoir storage capacity to meet Provincial guidelines.

“Building and maintaining high-quality water, wastewater, and stormwater infrastructure is an essential part of building livable communities. This announcement demonstrates the Province’s commitment to partnering with municipalities in order to deliver the public infrastructure Ontarians need. I am pleased that these projects will contribute to enhanced quality of life in London and the surrounding region for years to come,” said Deputy Premier and M.P.P. London North Centre Deb Matthews.
